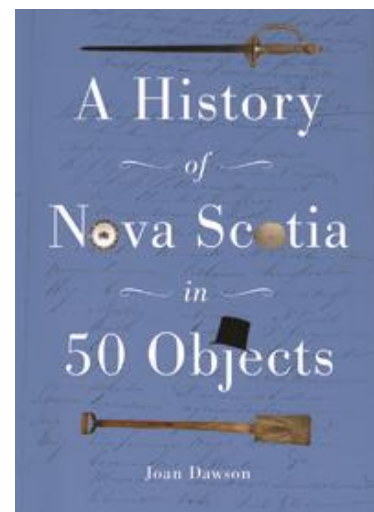

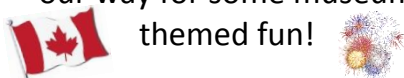


July 21st Pot Luck Supper

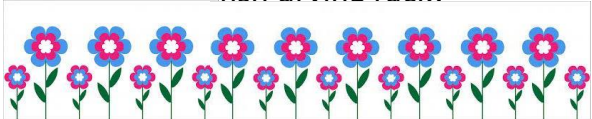
